## I. LIBERAL STUDIES (35 hours minimum)

You must complete 35 hours of Liberal Studies credit (foundation studies, distribution requirements, and a liberal studies elective). If you transfer to NAU from an Arizona community college and your transcript certifies that you completed either an Arizona General Education Curriculum (AGEC) or a Transfer General Education Core Curriculum (TGECC), you have satisfied NAU's liberal studies requirements.

**\*\* MAT 114 is not offered online at NAU for out-of-state students. NAU does not offer ENG 101/102 online. Please work with your advisor for options available.**

### Foundations (7 hours minimum)

ENG 105 Critical Reading and Writing OR ENG 101 (3 hours) and ENG 102 (3 hours) 4 - 6 hours

MAT 114 Quantitative Reasoning 3 hours

\*\* Placement test may be required. Prerequisites may be necessary before student is eligible for MAT 114 or 110.
