Suggested Site-Seeing in Northern Arizona

Visit one of the many national parks and monuments in the Flagstaff vicinity:

- Hike along the south rim or into the <u>Grand Canyon</u> (85 miles / 90 minutes northnorthwest of Flagstaff)
- ' <u>Walnut Canyon National Monument</u>, <u>Wupatki National Monument</u> and <u>Sunset Crater Volcano National Monument</u>
- Explore the high desert vistas including the Painted Desert at <u>Petrified Forest National Park</u> (150 miles east of Flagstaff)
- View the Sinagua Indians 20 room cliff-dwelling at <u>Montezuma Castle National Monument</u> (50 miles south of Flagstaff)

Stroll downtown Flagstaff, have dinner, shop for souvenirs, and visit Heritage Square (1 mile north of the NAU campus)

Visit the <u>Museum of Northern Arizona</u> and learn about the land and the peoples of the Colorado Plateau (5 miles north of the NAU campus)

Look through a telescope at <u>Lowell Observatory</u> where the ninth planet Pluto was discovered (1 mile north of the NAU campus, just west of downtown Flagstaff).

Visit the 100-year old <u>Riordan Historic Mansion</u> (adjacent to the NAU campus on Riordan Rd.)

View <u>Meteor Crater</u> and learn about the impact 50,000 years ago that resulted in a crater 550 feet deep and 4,000 feet across (45 miles east of Flagstaff)

Visit <u>The Museum Club</u>, an old-style Route 66 roadhouse and dance club in east Flagstaff.

Drive through Flagstaff along <u>Route 66</u> (Santa Fe Avenue) and soak up the history of the "mother road".

Travel south US-89A down winding switchbacks through Oak Creek Canyon and explore the beautiful Red Rock country in <u>Sedona, AZ</u> (26 miles / 45 minutes south of Flagstaff).

Take a sky-ride to the top of the San Francisco Peaks at the <u>Arizona Snowbowl</u> and admire the spectacular view (15 miles / 30 minutes north of the NAU campus and site of the conference banquet). Hart Prairie Lodge.

Do some hiking in and around Flagstaff and northern Arizona. Here are some suggestions:

- Hike Mt. Elden is within the Coconino National Forest.
- Hike the San Francisco Peaks is within the Coconino National Forest.
