HIS 498: FINAL RESEARCH PROJECT Guidelines on sources

I provide below STARTING POINTS for your final research project on India's partition. I would recommend that you run a list of final sources by me BEFORE you start work on writing up the research project. The use of ANY web sites except those I have listed below (and other than those of scholarly journals) MUST, repeat MUST, be cleared by me first. Failing to do that will have serious consequences for your grade for the project.

Start by CAREFULLY reading Mushirul Hasan's "Introduction" from his India's Partition: Process, Strategy and Mobilization. Delhi: Oxford University Press, 1993, AND David Gilmartin's 'Partition, Pakistan, and South Asian History: In Search of a Narrative' The Journal of Asian Studies 57, No. 4. (Nov., 1998). I will put up direct links to both essays from the course web page and syllabus.

I advise you to look at the **published sources listed in the footnotes** and follow up on those that seem relevant to your own research interests on the subject.
